<u>New Director Named for Catholic Housing</u> and Community Services

Suzanne O'Grady Laurito, MSS, has been named as the next Director of Catholic Housing and Community Services (CHCS) of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, according to a Feb. 28 announcement from the archdiocese. Her appointment became effective Feb. 26

She succeeds Heather Huot, MSW, LSW, who had served as Director of CHCS since 2020 until her appointment as Secretary for Catholic Human Services of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia by Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez in Dec. 2023.

"Catholic Housing and Community Services empowers and supports older adults across the Archdiocese, serving thousands of our sisters and brothers as they age with dignity," Huot said. "Mrs. Laurito brings the steadfast leadership and creative vision to further this vital mission of Catholic Human Services.



CHCS is recognized as a leading provider of senior living services throughout the Philadelphia region. Programs include senior housing, senior centers, parish-based eldercare programs, elder care helpline, and senior clubs.

"The charitable works of mercy undertaken by our Church resonate deeply with me. I have been fortunate to serve women and children contending with homeless and families involved in the child welfare system," said O'Grady Laurito.

"I am grateful for this opportunity to lead the dedicated and skilled staff of Catholic Housing and Community Services, as we support older adults aging with dignity and grace," she added.

O'Grady Laurito has dedicated more than 25 years of service to works of charity and mercy undertaken by the Archdiocese. She previously served in posts with Catholic Social Services including Program Director for Mercy Hospice and McAuley House (1997-2000) and Administrator for foster care and child welfare cases (2000-2003). She also held several positions of increasing responsibility within Catholic Housing and Community Services including Senior Project Manager for the Office for Community Development (2004-2014) and Assistant Director for CHCS (2014-2017, 2020-2024).

She also managed the archdiocesan Catholic Campaign for Human Development, an initiative through the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and served as the Grants and Events Manager for Face to Face (2018-2020).

For more than two decades, O'Grady Laurito has played an instrumental role in the expansion of the archdiocesan portfolio of affordable housing for seniors seeking to age in place within their communities. She has also been critical to efforts to provide a continuum of senior care services in senior centers and parishes located throughout the five-county metropolitan region.

O'Grady Laurito holds a Master of Social Services Degree in Advocacy, Planning, and Program Development from Bryn Mawr College and a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Philosophy and Speech Communications from Boston College.

On a daily basis father and son duo Bill and Matt Peck live out Jesus' call to "feed the hungry" that is found in Matthew 25. In 2023, they prepared over 7,000 meals for local people facing food insecurity in the Philadelphia region.

Both are longtime parishioners at Saint John Chrysostom in Wallingford. Four days a week, 95year-old Bill is in the parish kitchen at 4:00 a.m. He is soon joined there by his son Matt, 63.



Archdiocese of Philadelphia Kicks Off 49th Annual Rice Bowl Initiative

At the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center the Archdiocese of Philadelphia kicked off the 49th annual Catholic Relief Services' (CRS) Rice initiative. Rice Bowl Bowl is а nationwide Lenten program providing people of all ages with a way to put their faith into action through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

In 2023, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia's collection was up nearly 14% with over \$426,000 raised through Rice Bowl. Approximately seventy-five percent of those \$320,000, funds. or supported CRS' humanitarian response and development programs in nearly 100 countries where it operates. The remaining twenty-five percent of the funds, or \$106,000, went to Nutritional Development Services supporting hunger and efforts alleviation through its poverty network of 50 food cupboards throughout the Greater Philadelphia region.

This year, Rice Bowl officially began on Ash Wednesday, February 14, and will conclude on Holy Saturday, March 30. For additional information and resources for CRS Rice Bowl, please visit <u>here</u>.

Fatima Catholic Outreach Center Program Remains Strong and Growing 10 Years Later



In 2014, Saint Charles Borromeo and Our Lady of Fatima Parishes in Bucks County merged at the Saint Charles Borromeo location.

Following, Our Lady of Fatima Church became the Fatima Catholic Outreach Center, a social services ministry with a focus on serving the Hispanic communities of Lower Bucks County and Northeast Philadelphia. The center was initially a collaborative project of Catholic Social Services (CSS) and Saint Mary Medical Center.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, services at the center were suspended in April 2020. In September 2020 the doors reopened, this time under a new partnership between CSS and Saint Charles Borromeo Parish.

Modes of support at the site include social work, community immigration resources, accompaniment, domestic violence advocacy, seasonal English as a second language (ESL) classes, and interpretation services. Additional programs include gardening and arts programs, financial education, immigration legal services, citizenship classes, and meals for those experiencing homelessness.

"We at the Fatima Center are grateful for the opportunity Father Philip Forlano (Pastor of Saint Charles Borromeo Parish) has given us to assist the entire community with programs and services for everyone in the area," said Estela Reyes-Bugg, Administrator of CSS' Volunteer and Parish Community Relations. "It has been a great partnership that we hope and pray will continue as we work together to serve God's people."

Due to serving a large Latino population in the area, CSS identified the need for ESL classes at the site in 2014. Ten years later, the program is as strong as ever and growing.

"In March of 2023 we increased the number of students and added two more classes due to the increasing arrivals and individuals in need of learning English," Reyes-Bugg noted.

Classes range from 12 to 18 weeks and are offered twice a week 7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m.
